

Guest Speaker

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- ✓ Current Real-World Experiences and Examples.

Guest Speaker Requirements

- > This is the Least Time Consuming!
- Usually Asked for One Session, or Same Session Repeated Multiple Times.
- > Welcome On-Campus, But 'Zoom' is Still An Option.
- Students Are VERY Interactive.


Adjunct Professor

- Teach 1 or 2 Courses Which Last an Entire Semester (15 weeks).
- Curriculum is Usually Ready for You.
 - However, you can definitely modify to meet your goals.
- Major Advantage Incredible Impact on Students!
 - They will ABSOLUTELY remember you!



Adjunct Professor Requirements

- Most Colleges Require an Advanced Degree.
 - But NOT ALL do, so check around!!!
- Significant Time Commitment.
 - School will accommodate your schedule, but once you've agreed, you have to stick with it.
- Path to Career Change.
 - Awesome Retirement 'Gig'.

Mentoring Requirements




- No Specific Requirements
- Becomes Whatever the Team Want.
 - Bryant has *templates* for formalizing mentor/mentee arrangement.
- In Person or Remote: Both Work Well
- Faculty Member Should Stay Involved
 - Periodic check-ins
 - End of term review
 - Etc.



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Internship

- Potentially Most Beneficial to Student.
 - Gives Student Real-World Experience in PM.
 - Could Lead to Employment Opportunity.
- Also Beneficial to the Employer.
 - Well-Trained and Enthusiastic Practitioner of PM
 - Student is Under the Guidance of PM Professor
 - Bryant has Paid and Un-Pail Internships; School Offers Pay When Company Cannot.
